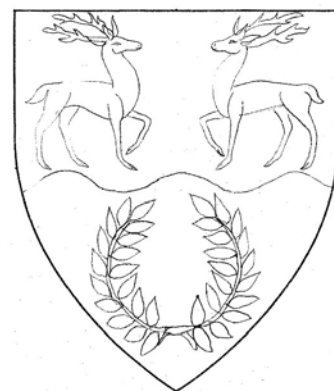
Unto the populace of Atlantia, greetings from Alisoun MacCoul of Elphane, Golden Dolphin Herald!

Abhainn Iarthair, Canton of. Device. Per fess wavy vert and argent, two stags trippant respectant and a laurel wreath counterchanged.



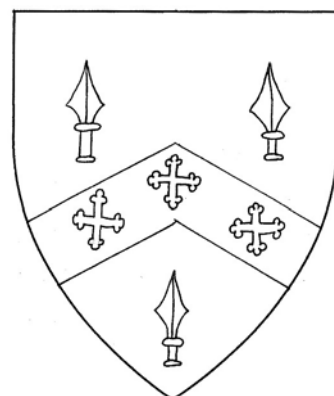
Argantan filia Branoc. Name.

Aurrie Peletiere. Name. Since the submitter had specifically requested an authentic feminine name, the Laurel staff modified the submitted given name of *Aurri* by adding a final “-e” to feminize it in a period manner.

Bright Hills, Barony of. Household name for Company of the White Horse.

Dagobert de Gallia. Name.

Jelyan de Coity. Name and device. Vert, on a chevron between three spearheads Or three crosses bottonny gules. The Laurel staff requested that the chevron be drawn more steeply with the center point higher in a more period manner.

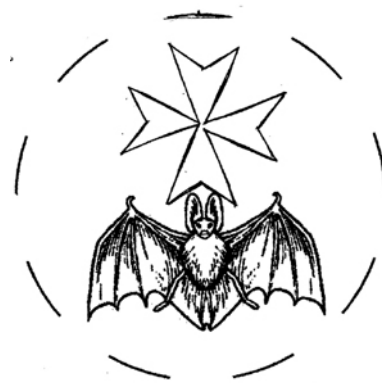


Juan Carlos Castillo de Coronado. Name.

Justin Stephen Cradoc. Name.

Margaret of Bordelay. Name. Since the submitter had requested authenticity for fourteenth century Yorkshire, the Laurel staff modified the submitted place name of *Borelaie*, which was documented from the eleventh century, to a form they felt more appropriate to the period for which she had requested authenticity.

Michel de Saint Didier. Name and badge. (Fieldless) A Maltese cross and a rermouse conjoined in pale sable.



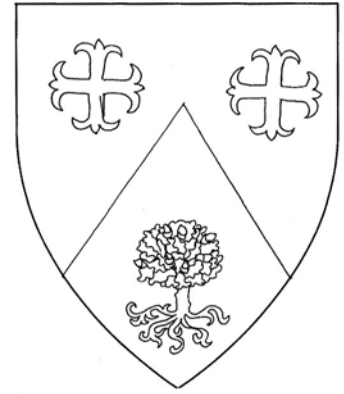
Miriel de Nedham. Name.

Nanne of Hunterston. Name and device. Per chevron purpure and Or, two crosses patonce Or and an oak tree eradicated proper, fructed Or.

Padraig mac Nechtain. Name. Because the submitter had requested authenticity for Irish, the Laurel staff modified the submitted name of Padraig MacNaughton, which mixed an Irish given name with an anglicized Irish surname, to make it entirely Irish.

Philip ap Mereduth. Name.

William of Kenilworth. Change of name from William de Kenillewurd.
