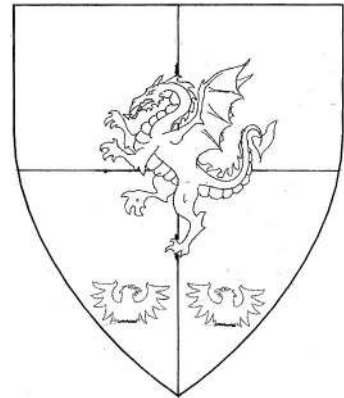
Unto the populace of Atlantia, greetings from Alisoun MacCoul of Elphane, Golden Dolphin Herald!

Herein you will find the results of the deliberations of the College of Heraldry of Atlantia during the month of December, 2007.

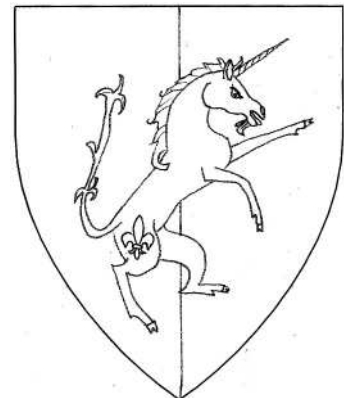
ACCEPTANCES

The following submissions have been accepted and included on a Letter of Intent to the College of Arms from Atlantia dated 29 December, 2007:

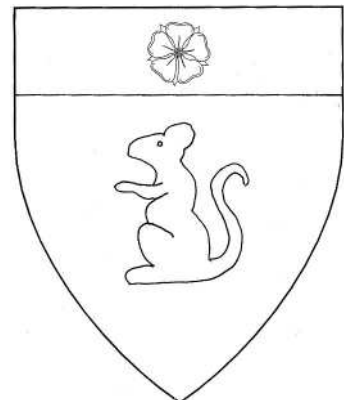
Acelina le Dragon. Device. Quarterly argent and Or, a dragon segreant and in base two demi-eagles, heads respectant, vert. This was pended for redrawing by Golden Dolphin in November, 2007.



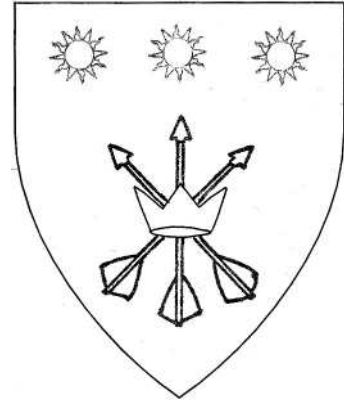
Anneke Raudhe. Change of device. Per pale azure and sable, a unicorn rampant contourny argent charged on the flank with a fleur-de-lys azure.



Aularia Diez. Device. Azure, a rat sejant erect and on a chief argent a rose azure barbed and seeded proper.



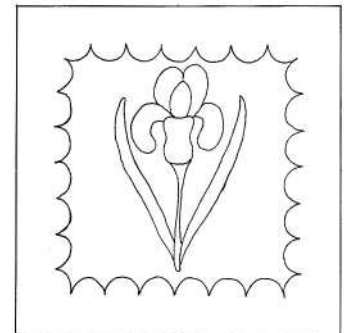
Barre FitzRobert of York. Change of device. Sable, a sheaf of three arrows inverted Or surmounted by a coronet argent and in chief three suns Or. He is entitled to the use of the coronet as he was made a court baron of the kingdom of Atlantia on 3 February, 2007.



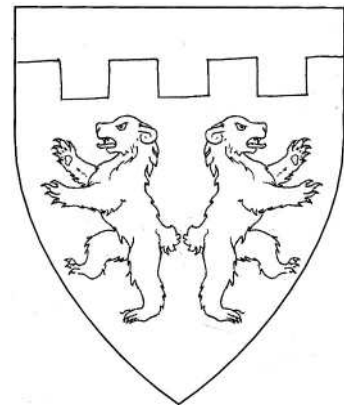
Barre FitzRobert of York. Change of badge. (Fieldless) On a sun Or a horned owl perched atop an arrow fesswise reversed azure.



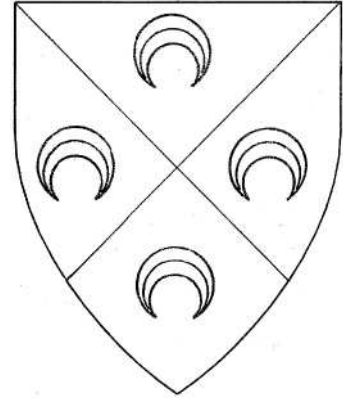
Beatrice Villani. Badge. Argent, an iris purpure slipped and leaved within a bordure invected vert.



Bjørn trollfirzki. Name and device. Azure, two bears rampant addorsed argent and a chief embattled Or. The name was submitted as Bjørn av Trollfjorden. In accordance with his desire for authenticity we modified the given name to the form *Bjørn* as shown on page 8 of Geirr Bassi's *The Old Norse Name*. We felt that *Trollfjorðr* was a reasonable place name construct based on Old Norse terms, but that the byname would be *trollfirzki* following the pattern of the documented adjectival byname *vestfirzki* for someone from the West Fjords (*ibid.*).



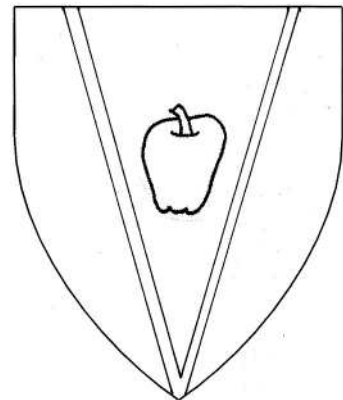
Elisabeth Hänsler. Device. Per saltire azure and gules, four crescents pendant Or.



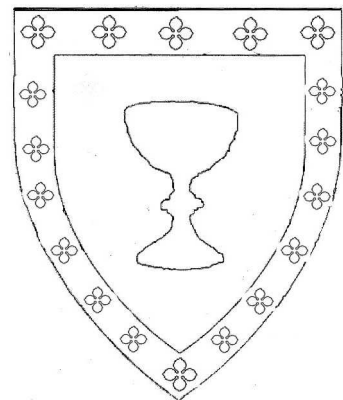
Gráinne inghean Dauídh uí Chonchobhair. Name and device. Azure, an eagle and on a chief doubly enarched argent, three annulets azure. The name was submitted as Gráinne inghean Dauídh uí Chonchobhair, but the next to last word was modified to match the pattern for “Irish Simple Patronymic with Clan Affiliation Bynames” shown in Krossa’s “Quick and Easy Gaelic Names”.



Grettir Tindsson. Device. Azure, on a pile purpure fimbriated argent, an apple Or.

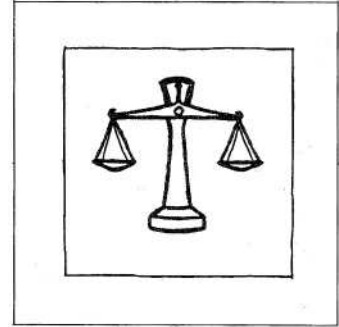


Isabetta del Gatta. Device. Gules, a goblet Or within a bordure Or, semy of quatrefoils gules. The device was pended for redrawing by Golden Dolphin in November, 2007.

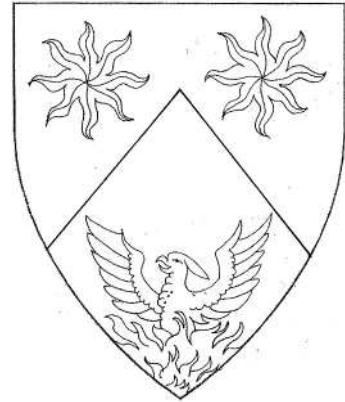


Ivarr Thorgislsson. Change of name from Ivarr ffening.

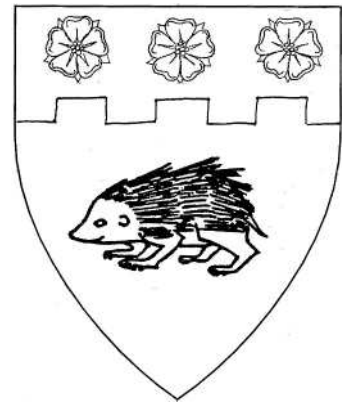
Jason Kynslay. Badge. Sable, a standing balance within a bordure Or.



Larisa Mikhailovna. Device. Per chevron argent and azure, two estoiles azure and issuant from base a phoenix argent issuant from flames Or. This was pended for redrawing by Golden Dolphin in November, 2007.

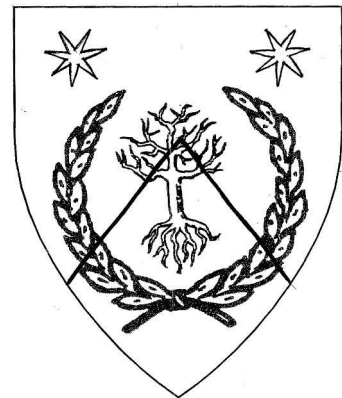


Livia Zanna. Device. Azure, a hedgehog statant and on a chief embattled argent three roses proper.

Sevenhills, Canton of. Name and device. Per chevron azure and argent, a tree blasted and eradicated within a laurel wreath and in chief two mullets of seven points all counterchanged.



Stierbach, Barony of. Order name for the Award of the Bull and the Crescent.

Stierbach, Barony of. Order name for the Award of the Silver Compass.

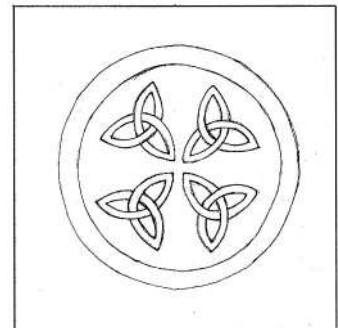
Stierbach, Barony of. Order name for the Award of the Silver Glove.

Stierbach, Barony of. Order name for the Order of the Silver Heart.)

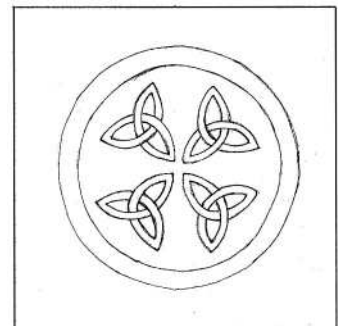
Tir-y-Don, Barony of. Release of badge. (Fieldless) A phoenix sable rising from flames proper atop a tower argent. A letter signed by the Baron, Baroness, Seneschale and Herald of the Barony attest to the desire of the Barony to release this badge which was registered in July, 1997.



Turgeis Hakonsson and Sunniva Kyrre. Badge. Azure, in saltire four triquetras Or, points to center, within an annulet argent.



Turgeis Hakonsson and Sunniva Kyrre. Badge. Azure, in saltire four triquetras argent, points to center, within an annulet Or.

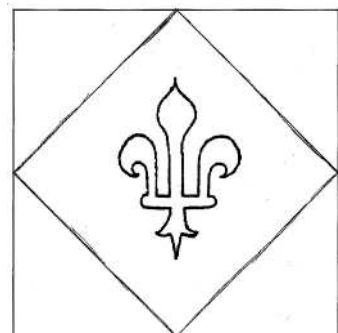

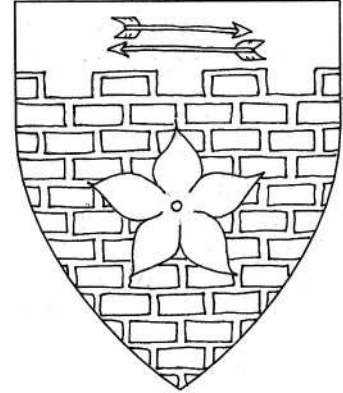

The following items have been returned for further work:

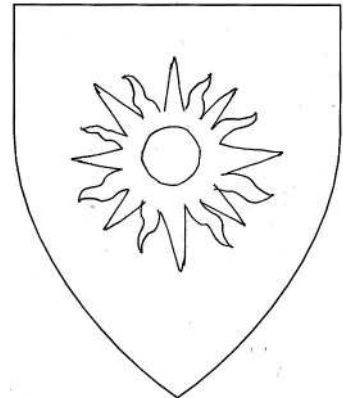
Anneke Raudhe. Badge. Per pale azure and sable, on a lozenge throughout argent a fleur-de-lys azure. Unfortunately, since the lozenge throughout must also be considered for conflict as if it were a field chapé, this lovely badge technically conflicts with Elwyn of Snow Hill (“Per chevron azure, ermined argent, and argent, in base a fleur-de-lis azure.”) There is one difference for the change in field, but no difference for the change in position of the fleur-de-lys in Elwyn’s device since it is forced by the tinctures of the field.



Esperanza Sussana Fletcha. Name and device. Argent, masoned gules, a cinquefoil and on a chief embattled sable in pale an arrow fesswise and an arrow fesswise reversed argent. While the documentation for *Esperanza* as a given name was copious, no documentation was provided for the submitted spelling of *Sussana* which the submitter apparently prefers. While the submitter provided documentation for the English surname *Fletcher* and the Spanish and/or Catalan surname *Flecha*, again no documentation was provided for the submitted spelling. Unfortunately, the device as drawn, with its very pronounced gules masoning immediately adjacent to the sable chief violates the Society's rules on contrast.

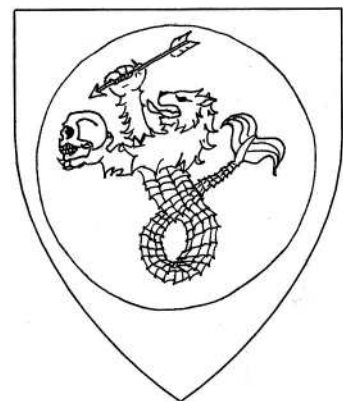


Sorcha ó Preachain. Name and device. Azure, on a sun argent a roundel azure. Unfortunately, the provided documentation for the use of *ó* in patronymics in the sixteenth century did not say what was quoted on her forms and the source for *Eoghan An Preachain* has been modernized or anglicized and do not refer to original source material. Additionally, in the name cited, *Preachain* is a nominative noun with an article which is obviously being used as a descriptive (Eoghan the Crow) and so does not provide real evidence for a genitive form or use with a patronym. We were able to document *préachán* as a common noun meaning a bird of prey or kite or raven or crow. Unfortunately, while the sun is now drawn acceptably, it must be returned for conflict with Stuart of Lindley (“Azure, a sun eclipsed sable, a chief argent.”) as there is only one difference for adding the chief (changing only the tincture of the does not provide the second difference) and with Fiona O'Mull (“Azure, on a sun within a bordure wavy argent, a unicorn's head coupé azure.”) where there is a difference for adding the bordure but no difference for changing only the type of the charge on the sun.



Stierbach, Barony of. Order name for the Award of the Silver Axe. Unfortunately, this conflicts directly with the Order of the Silver Axe recently registered to the Barony of Fontaine dans Sable in the Outlands.

Valgard of Mors. Device. Sable, on a plate a sealion erect maintaining with its dexter paw an arrow bendwise sinister and with its sinister paw a skull facing to dexter gules. Unfortunately, this conflicts with Sean a' Claidheamh (“Sable, on a plate a hound crouching to sinister upon a pile inverted sable.”), Shron Ravenhair (“Sable, on a plate a mullet of six points throughout sable charged with a compass star of twelve points throughout pierced argent.”) and Cassandra of the East Winds (“Sable, on a plate, a flame gules.”) with only one difference for the changes to the charges on the roundel.
