Alis Ruadh -New Name

Alis: is a female Gaelic name dated to 1267 and 1285 in Mari ingen Brian meic Donnchada's "Index of Names in Irish Annals" (<http://medievalscotland.org/kmo/AnnalsIndex/Feminine/Alis.shtml>).

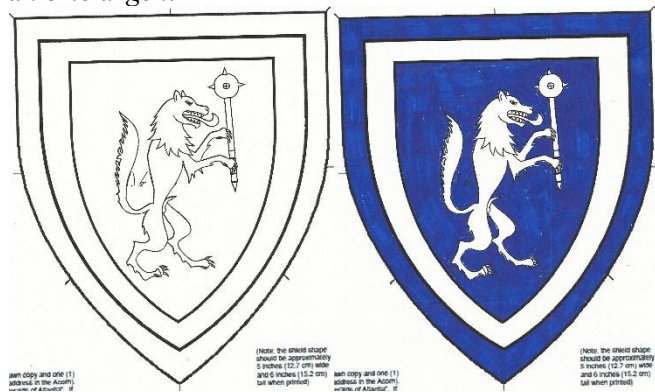
Ruadh: is a Gaelic descriptive byname meaning "red" also found in Mari's "Index" (<http://medievalscotland.org/kmo/AnnalsIndex/DescriptiveBynames/Ruadh.shtml>) with relevant Annals dates of 1266, 1268, 1272, 1284, 1297, 1298 and others.

Descriptive bynames for woman always need to be lenited unless they fall within certain narrow exceptions. However, there is no spelling change when 'R' is lenited, so the submitted spelling is fine. See "The Spelling of Lenited Consonants in Gaelic" by Sharon Krossa (<http://medievalscotland.org/scotland/lenition.shtml>).

(Golden Dolphin Note: Alys, Ogress mention during in-kingdom commentary that either Aife Ruadh (July 2015) and Aine Ruadh (July 2009, An Tir) may be a visual conflict with the name)

Arwen: Arwen is the submitter's given name as verified by her driver's license. Submitter is using legal name allowance to register the name.

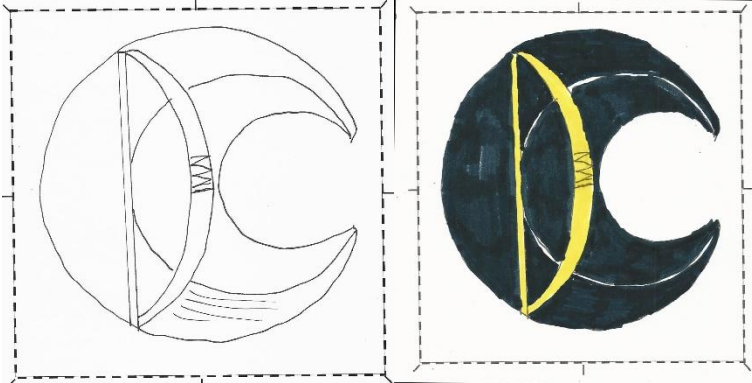

(Golden Dolphin: During in-kingdom commentary, commenters expressed concern about the identifiability of the mace. The mace is needed to clear conflict with John Guthrie as registered through An Tir in April, 2004 "Quarterly gules and sable all ermined, a fox rampant contourny within an orle argent, there is DC for changes to field.)

Old Item: (Fieldless) On a decrescent sable a bow Or, to be released.

(Golden Dolphin Note: The emblazon was changed by kingdom, because the original emblazon appeared to be a fimbriated crescent and the submitter doesn't wish for the crescent to be fimbriated. The emblazon was recolored by kingdom to remove the fimbriation. The submitted has approved changes to the artwork. Original artwork is attached.)

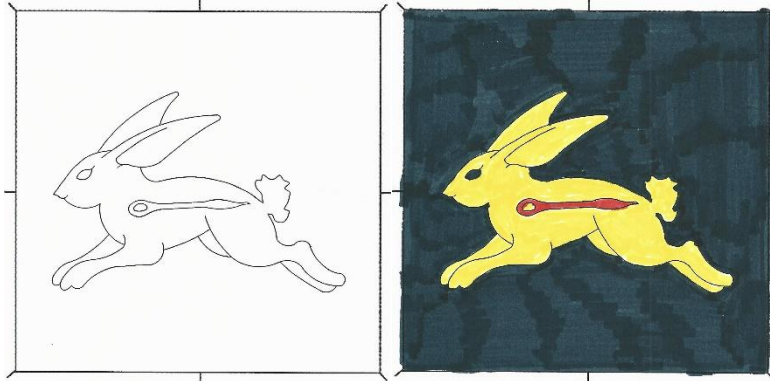

April 2015 Atlantian Return of "Sable, on a rabbit courant to sinister Or a needle fesswise point to dexter gules"

Unfortunately, this badge was returned for conflict with Richard Blakethorn, reg. 12/89 via Ansteorra "Sable, a unicornate rabbit courant to sinister Or." There is 1 distinct change for adding a needle, for a badge to be registered it needs to have 2 distinct changes from any other registered armory. It was suggested in in-kingdom commentary that the submitter could change the direction of the rabbit and it is currently conflict free. Also please advise the submitter when redrawing the badge to make the needle a little bit larger.

December 2012 Atlantian Return of "Or, a rabbit courant to sinister sable charged on the hip with a needle bendwise sinister threaded Or"

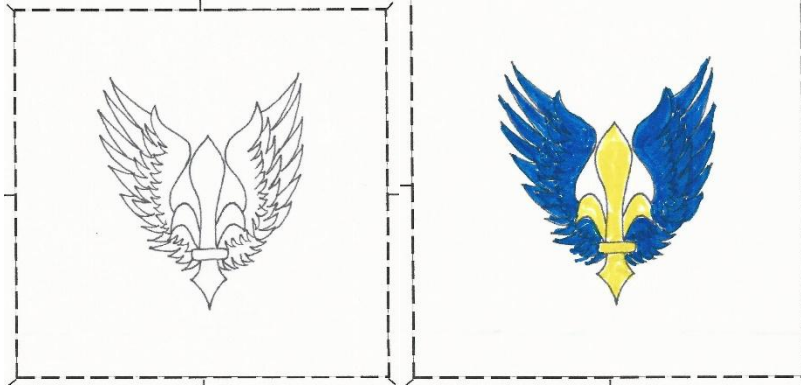

(Golden Dolphin Note: Precedent states that use of seeress as name is not presumptions. Commenters questioned whether the byname Vǫlu "seeress" was presumptuous. It is not. This byname (and the occupation it is derived from) refers to real women who did real things. As such, it is not an unmistakable claim to magical powers. It is parallel to the Norse byname sjóna, ruled registerable in August of 2008, and Gaelic bynames with similar meanings, ruled registerable in December 1997. [Vǫlu-Helena in Flamska, 10/2012 LoAR, A-Ansteorra]. Also Norse name may be registered without the use of accent marks)

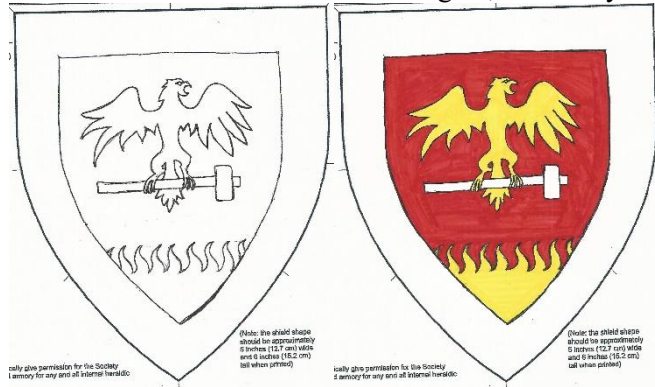

Device Submission History

May 2015 Atlantian Return of "Gules, an eagle head to sinister Or maintaining in its talons a hammer fesswise reversed argent, a base rayonny Or within a bordure argent"

The device must be returned for redraw because the way the rayonny line is drawn as "wavy-crested" As per the February 2012 LoAR, Sibry Thorne's device "Per bend sinister rayonny azure and gules, a crescent argent and a phoenix rising from the flames Or" was returned because of how the rayonny line was drawn.

"The rayonny line of division must be drawn in a much more regular and symmetrical fashion, not like the long-forbidden "wavy crested" as depicted here."

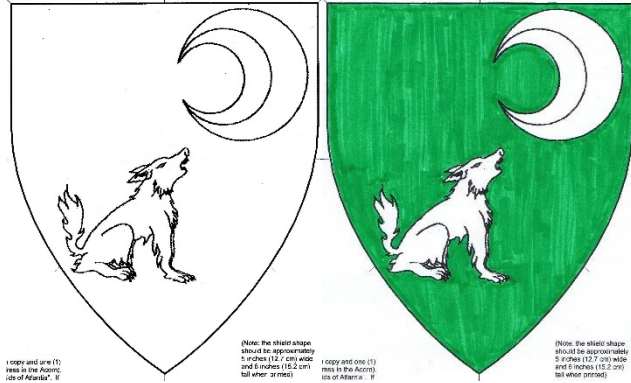

Marco: Smith's "Names in 15th Century Florence and her Dominions: the Condado" in the list of masculine given names at <https://www.s-gabriel.org/names/juliana/condado/mensalpha.html> shows Marco occurring with 255 instances and Antonio occurring with 2206 instances.

Fortini: The same article in the list of family names at <https://www.s-gabriel.org/names/juliana/condado/familyalpha.html> shows the family name Fortini occurring four times in the source material.

Luciano: The given name Luciano appears once in "Italian Names from Florence, 1427" at <https://www.s-gabriel.org/names/ferrante/catasto/names.txt>.

The use of double given names as well as patronymics formed using di in period are indicated in Appendix A of the current standards.

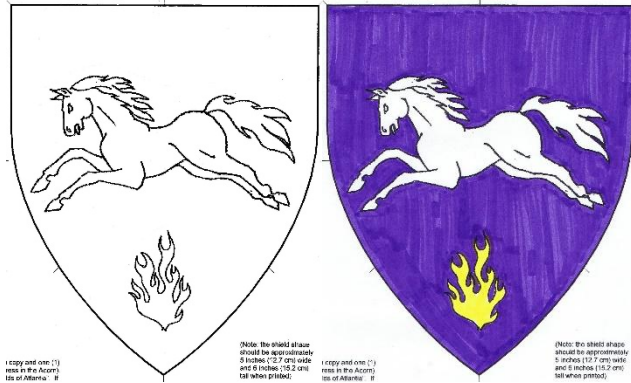

Raven's Cove, Barony of -New Order Name "Award of the Golden Heart of Raven's Cove"

Golden: is an order name documented in "Medieval Secular Order Names: Standard Forms of Order Names" by Juliana de Luna (Julia Smith), Siren Herald

<http://heraldry.sca.org/names/order/new/ListingOfStandardForms.html#AllColorCharge>. Golden is allowed for Order Names using Lingua Anglica based on the following order names, from English Leon d'Or (Golden Lion) and from French Arbre d'Or (Golden Tree) and Toison d'Or (Golden Fleece).

Heart: The OED s.v. <heart>, n. dates the meaning "A figure or representation of the human heart; esp. a conventionalized symmetrical figure formed of two similar curves meeting in a point at one end and a cusp at the other. Also, an object, as a jewel or ornament, in the shape of a heart" to 1463: "The seid broche herte of gold to be hange, naylyd, and festnyd vpon the shryne". We find the modern spelling <heart> used for a stylized figure in 1529 (referring to a playing card).

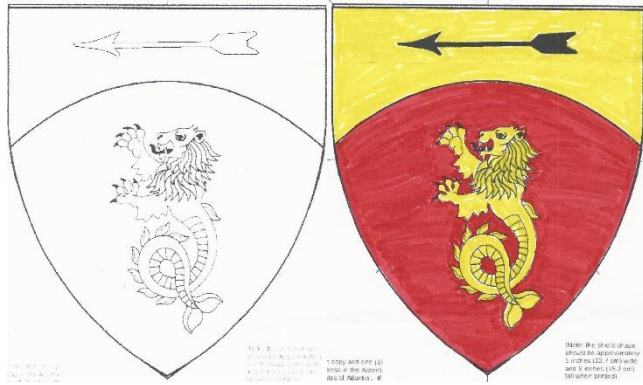
of Raven's Cove: Branch Name Allowance. Raven's Cove is Barony in Atlantia. Registered in July 2011

The order name follows the pattern of Color + Heraldic Charge.

(Golden Dolphin Note: Addition of the Barony name, Raven's Cove, clears possible conflict with Order of the Golden Heart, registered to the Barony of Vativia, via Calontir in August, 1983.)

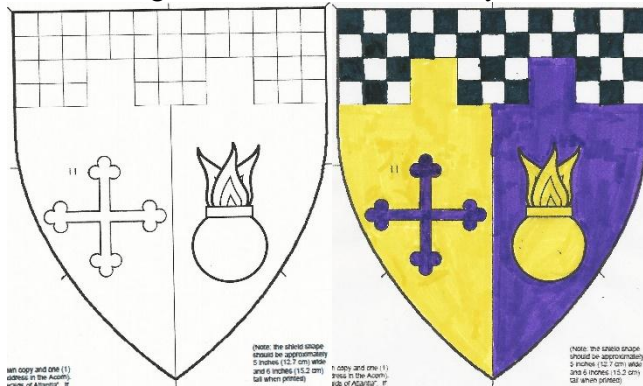

Seamus Tremayne of Argyll -Resub Device "Per pale Or and purple, a cross bottony and a grenade counterchanged, a chief embattled checky sable and argent"



Submission History:

March 2013 Laurel Return of "Per pale Or and purple, a Latin cross bottony and the sinister half of a horned Corinthian helmet affronty counterchanged, a chief embattled checky argent and sable."

"This device is returned for redraw, for violating SENA A2C2 which states "Elements must be drawn to be identifiable." The half-helmet here is not readily identifiable."

"The submitter provided documentation of heraldic charges in period divided per pale, either the sinister or dexter half. However, all of the charges thus cited are very common ones: fleur-de-lys, mullet, and wagon wheel. Their very familiarity makes identifying a dexter or sinister half possible. The horned Corinthian helmet, on the other hand, is a charge completely unattested in period armory."

"The submitter also mentioned charges dimidiated in per pale marshalling contexts. While this did occur in period, it was fairly uncommon, most likely due to the inherent problems with identification. Appealing to the types of dimidiation seen only in marshalling forces us to consider this as a design with the appearance of marshalling, which is not allowed under SENA A6F as being presumptive."

October 2015 Atlantian Return "Per pale Or and purple, a Thor's helm and an exploding grenade counterchanged a chief embattled checky sable and argent"

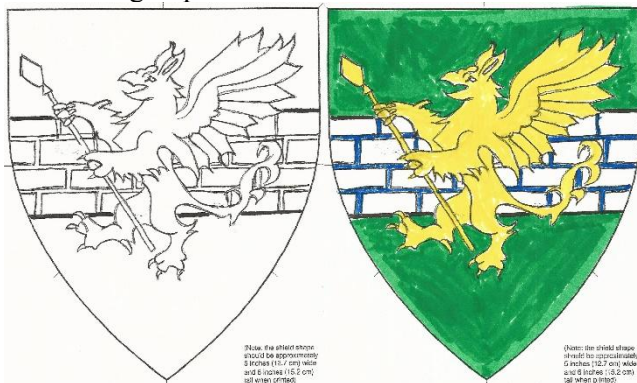

November 2015 Atlantian Return of "Wrad map Welisc"

Unfortunately this name has to be returned again for rework. As per SENA P.N.1.B.1, Name phrases must be from a single time and place. The example uses inghean Áda which mixes

modern Gaelic with Middle Irish Gaelic and is not allowed, the name must be all modern Gaelic or Middle Irish Gaelic. Map Welisc uses a Pictish patronymic marker with an Old English name. If the submitter wants to use Welisc, then the name has to use an Old English patronymic marker.
May 2015 Atlantian Return of "Wrad map Wyllys map Uthor"

"The name is being returned because the documentation provided does not match the name the submitter wants. Documentation could not be found to match the name the submitter wants during in-kingdom commentary. In order to register a name, the documentation must prove the name was used prior to 1650. Also the structure of the name must be documented as used prior to 1650."

"The device must be returned because the name was returned for rework."

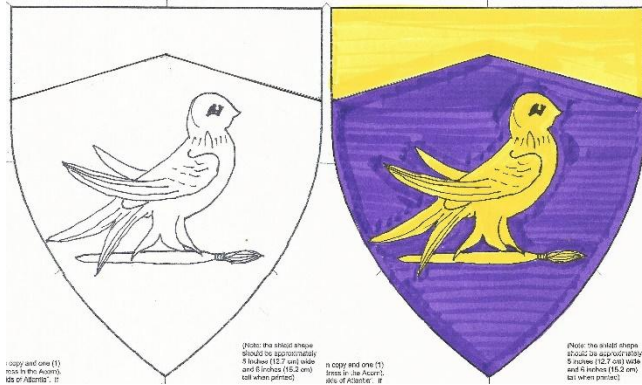

"The Device must be returned because the name is being returned. In order for a device to be registered it must have a registered name or name in progress to attach to it. The device is also being returned for a style issue. Fields divided into more than four part, must have good contrast. Azure and Vert do not have good contrast."

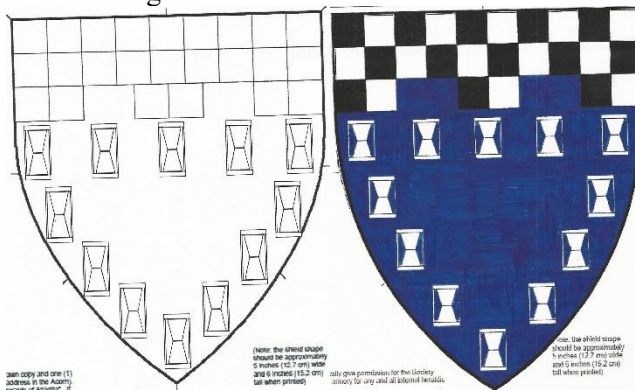
Aye der Dunkele Rotvogel -New Device "Purpure, a martlet contourny holding in its claws a brush fesswise bristles to sinister, a chief chevrony Or"



This device is returned for running afoul of SENA A2A which states "On first registration of any particular element, documentation must be presented that the element and its depiction may be registered. This means presenting evidence that the element is eligible to be registered and that the specific depiction is attested or is otherwise compatible with period style." No documentation was provided by the submitter or during commentary indicating that a chevron chevrons was a registerable charge.

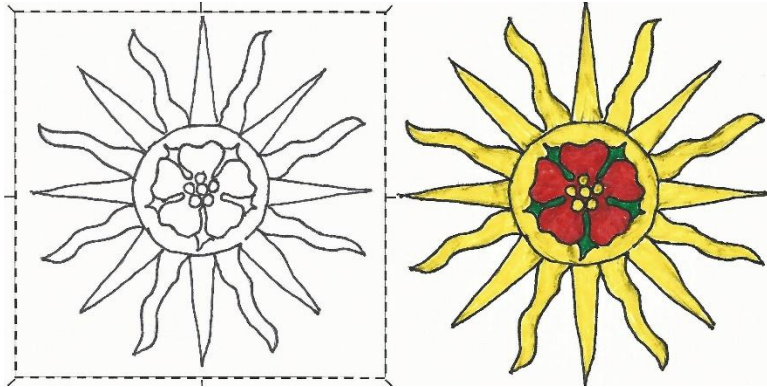
Brigit Griphyne -New Device "Azure, an orle of twelve hour glasses argent, a chief chequy embattled sable and argent"



This device is being administratively returned because the line drawing does not match the color copy of the device.

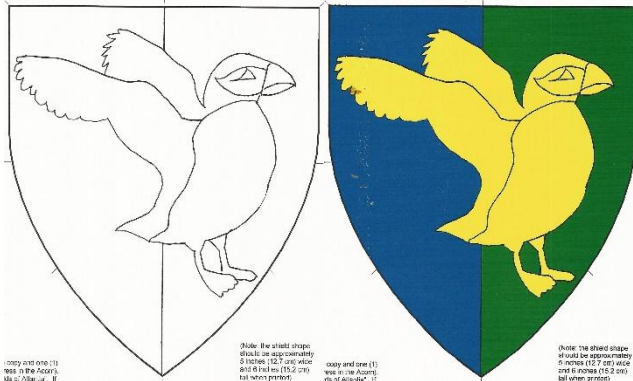
Brigit of Mercia -New Badge "(Fieldless) A sun Or charged with a rose proper"



This badge is returned for conflict with Edward IV of England. Badge (Important non-SCA badge). (Fieldless) A rose gules en soleil Or. There is only 1DC for the fieldless bribe.

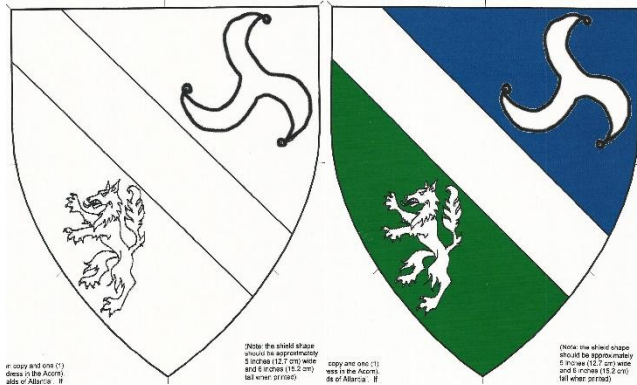
Caterina di Paulo - New Device “Per pale Azure and Vert a puffin rising to sinister Or”



This device is being returned for conflict with two devices. First conflict is Margarita Ivanovna Novgorodetsa, December of 2014 (via the Middle): Sable, a Russian firebird rising to sinister Or. There is only 1 DC for changes to the field. There isn't a second DC for type of bird because the Russian Firebird is not a period charge. Second conflict is George Silver Tongue, device registered in March of 1978: Vert, a gamecock springing to sinister, wings addorsed, Or. There is only 1 DC for changes to the field. There is no DC for type of bird because DCs are only granted for type of bird when the bird is in period posture, the only period posture for a gamecock is close.

Ena inghean Diarmata -New Device “Per bend azure and vert, a bend between a triskelion and a wolf rampant argent”



This device is being returned for conflict with Ailith of Heronter, September of 2002 (via AÆthelmearc): Per bend azure and vert, a bend between a cross crosslet and a sprig bendwise argent. There is 1 DC for change of type of secondaries. Since animate charges do not have comparable postures with inanimate charges, there is not a DC granted for change posture between the wolf and the sprig.

Faye Trees -New Badge “(Fieldless) An acorn bendwise enflamed all proper”

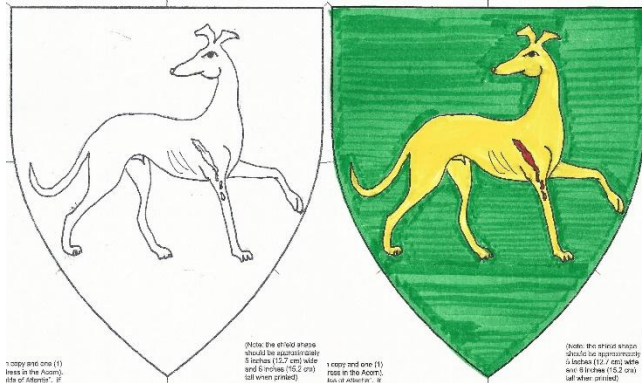


This badge is being returned for redraw because the acorn is not properly enflamed. An acorn correctly enflamed would have little spurts of flames all around it, not just on the top and one side.

“This device is returned for redraw, for violating SENA A2C2 which states "Elements must be drawn to be identifiable." The enflaming here is not distinguishable from leaved Or. A tree correctly enflamed would have little spurts of flames all around it, not just on the crown, and would not have the entire crown engulfed in flame.” [Máire Dhocair inghean Chiaráin, R-Meridies, Jan 2013, LoAR]

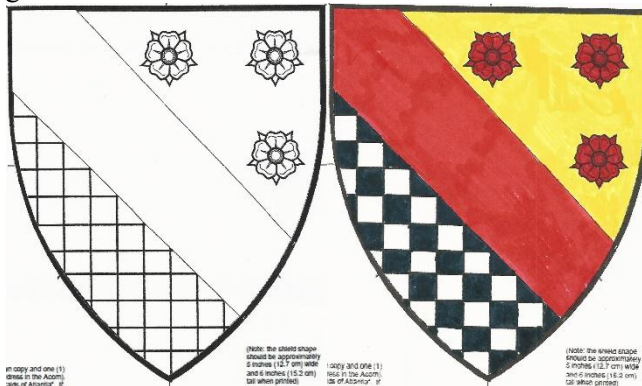
This device must be returned for multiple conflicts. First conflict is Tofa Sigurdardóttir, device registered in October of 2014 (via Drachenwald): Vert, a greyhound statant contourny and in chief three Thor's hammers Or. There is one DC for removal of the Thor's hammers, there is no changes granted for the vulning or gouttes. It is also in conflict with Berthold Wolfer, device registered in February of 1999 (via Drachenwald): Per fess azure and vert, a wolf passant contourny Or. There is one DC for changes to field, there is no changes granted for the vulning or the gouttes. There is no DC for the gouttes because the gouttes appear to be part of the vulning and by precedent vulning grants no DC.

“This device is returned for conflict with the device of Laszlo Oroszlanveri, Vert, a lion rampant dismembered Or, multiply vulned gules. Under both the Rules for Submissions and the Standards for Evaluation, there is a CD/DC for the addition of the secondary charge group, but no difference is granted for the vulning or dismemberment. We have period examples showing the same arms drawn with both a dismembered lion and with a non-dismembered lion; dismembering is therefore treated as a blazonable artistic detail not worth difference. Likewise, we have period examples showing the same arms drawn with and without vulning. Vulning is sometimes depicted in a large enough fashion to be considered a tertiary charge, were it anything else -- and yet, as it comes and goes at artistic whim, so we must treat it as a blazonable artistic detail not worth difference.” [Cuilen Ó Caoimh, Lochac 08/2012-R]
